Robert Road (Spouse to Tranquil) To Begin Construction

The Town is beginning the next phase of enhancements to Robert Road from Spouse Drive to Tranquil Blvd.

The low bidder is Fann Contracting of Prescott, among 12 contractors who bid on the project. It was awarded at the February 24 Town Council meeting.

The \$1,779,993 price tag to build the road is being cash funded by the Town from the 0.33% sales tax that is levied specifically for road construction.

These improvements will expand the road from two to four traffic lanes,



add curb/gutter/sidewalk, street lights and storm drain, and continue the same road template as previous re-construction phases.

Construction is scheduled to begin March 7th, 2011 and last approximately six months.

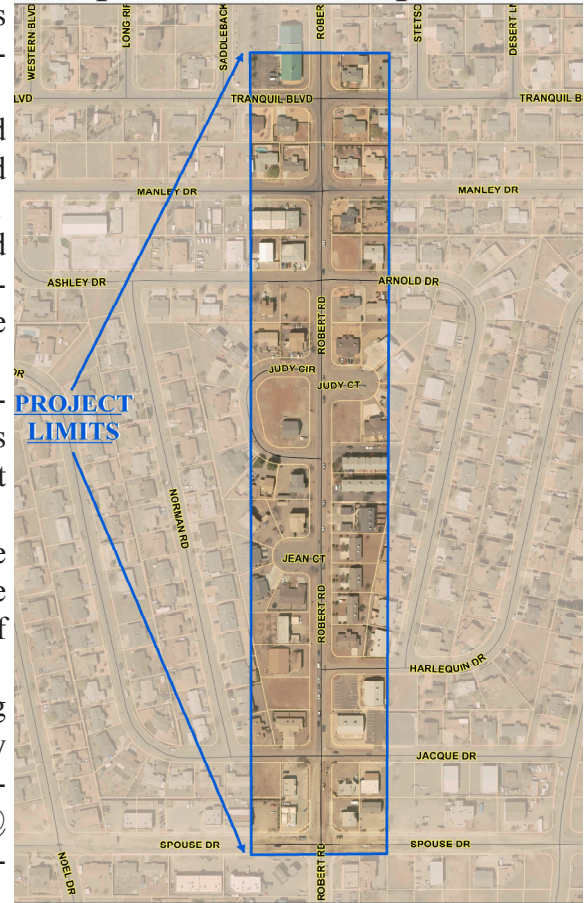
Please take caution and plan for delays when traveling through this area during the construction.

Town To Install Trees on Highway 69 Median

In cooperation with the current ADOT project to install a safety median barrier on Highway 69, the Town of Prescott Valley will install tree landscape improvements within the Town limits fronting the entrance of

Victorian Estates.

Trees will also be added to the existing landscaped median fronting the Crossroads commercial center.

Tree installation is anticipated to be completed by April 15th.

PVEDF Receives \$278K Competitive Grant for Job Creation

The Prescott Valley Economic Development Foundation (PVEDF) was recently successful in acquiring a state-wide competitive grant to incentivize the creation of industrial jobs.

The grant will enable four existing businesses to invest \$2,695,396 in capital in the area. A combined 41 new jobs will positively impact the region with an annual payroll of \$1,273,196.

Project A: MI Windows & Doors. The project (Energy Core) would add a new high end, energy efficient replacement window line to the western region of the country. The project expansion will add 11 fulltime jobs with an annual payroll impact of \$438,338.

Project B: Nest Energy Services, LLC. The project (NEST's Raptor So-

lar Light Trailers) would expand their production capacity to develop/build and deliver up to 210 Raptor units to the US Marine Corps. The project expansion will add 15 assembly and fabricator jobs with an annual payroll impact of \$250,000 with capital investment over \$250,000 in facility expansion and new production equipment.

Project C: Printpack Inc. The expansion project will add new product capacity to their production and new fulltime positions within their plant by adding three machines. The new production equipment will increase capital investment by \$1,368,034 and add 9 new jobs with an annual payroll impact of \$404,858.

tems, Inc. The proposed expansion would expand their design, production, and new environmentally friendly lines needed to gain additional national markets. The expansion will add 6 new fulltime jobs with an annual payroll impact of \$180,000. The investment will provide three new automatic loading machines, increasing production capacity to meet two new major customer needs.

The Town contracts with PVEDF for the recruitment of industry and jobs to Prescott Valley.
